

Obligation to provide information clause - CCTV

Pursuant to Articles 13(1) and 13(2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, we hereby inform that:

is the Controller of personal data.

CCTV is placed in a fixed manner (non-movable) outside and inside the building of the Facility.

CCTV covers the premises of Spiroflex Sp. z o.o., addr.: ul. Wojska Polskiego 6E 39-300 Mielec.

CCTV covered area is understood as:

- building of the Facility (entrance/exit, halls, production floors),
- area around the Facility (pavements, car parks, access roads).

Legal grounds for using CCTV:

- Article 22(2) of the act of 26 June 1974 the Labour Code (Journal of Laws of 2018, items 917, 1000, 1076),
- Article 6(1)(f) of the General Data Protection Regulation of 27 April 2016.

All data registered by CCTV cameras are recorded on a data recorder and are available for 30 days. After this period, data are removed through automatic overwriting.

Only image (without sound) is registered and recorded on the storage media.

The Facility safeguards events registered by CCTV that pose a threat to human safety, life and health or may result in any damage to or theft of property for evidence purposes:

- at the request of authorities that carry out relevant proceedings.

Each safeguarding of events registered by CCTV is carried out upon a written request submitted to Spiroflex Sp. Z o.o.

Such safeguarded CCTV data are made available only to relevant authorities that conduct proceedings as regards such registered event e.g. the police, prosecutor's office, courts that act on the basis of separate provisions of law.

Your personal data are kept in the database of Spiroflex Sp. z o.o. and you have the right to access the content of your data and the right to rectify them.

You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (referred to as GDPR).

Your personal data will be stored in a manner ensuring confidentiality, integrity and availability according to the applicable provisions of law.
